In the academic front from admission to declaration of result all are managed through a computerized system.

6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

6.3.1 Some teachers of our college are members of the Board of Studies of different departments of the West Bengal State University which is our affiliating University. They as the members of Board of Studies take an important role for curriculum development. As per rules, regulation and methods of the University in CBCS syllabus framing workshop the concerned teachers in the department of Sociology and Food and Nutrition took active part.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning :

- Leaves are granted generously by the authority to the teachers for the above mentioned purpose.
- Faculties are also encouraged to present paper in international /national seminar /conferences.

Seminar/Special Talks:

Three UGC sponsored National level seminar was organized by the departments Geography, Chemistry and Philosophy-Sociology.

- The University norms are followed for examination and evaluation of UG students.
- College conducts Selection Test prior to the finals for all courses.
- The class tests are taken by all departments as and when required. Results of Mid terminal and Selection Tests are communicated to the students and evaluated answer scripts are shown to the students for their qualitative improvement.
- The progress is reported to the Guardians specially to the weaker students.

- One teacher have been awarded Ph.D. Degree and another teacher has obtained M.Phil. Degree.
- Some teachers are pursuing Ph.D. work.
- Teachers are encouraged to engage themselves in research projects. A minor research project has been sanctioned in the Department of Sociology.
- A good number of faculties are involved in preparing and presenting their papers in International and National level seminar.

- Wi-Fi zone are installed in the college campus.

- Upgrading and expansion of the laboratories is continued.
- Accession, searching (author, title etc.), issuance of books are computerised. Bar coding is on progress.
- Physics laboratory has been set up to cater the students from the next academic session i.e. 2017-18
- CCTV is installed in the college campus at different strategic points.
